Skiing/Snowboarding

Snowmobile Tours

Explore Whistler's beautiful backcountry by snowmobile with an experienced & knowledgeable guide. From family tours to more aggressive tours high up in the alpine of the Whistler backcountry, let us help you find the best fit for you! Tour times can range from 2 to 4 hours depending on the tour and your ability level. Starting from \$199.99 per person

Vallea Lumina

Discover Whistler's newest attraction - Vallea Lumina is multimedia night walk in pursuit of hidden wonders. Ignite your senses with an immersive light show set in the forested surrounds of Cougar Mountain. An unforgettable evening adventure perfect for all ages, groups and families. The Vallea Lumina pathway is 1.5 km of undulating trail and takes between 50 minutes to 80 minutes to complete depending on each visitor. Please plan for the experience including transportation to take 2 hours. The whole experience is in the coastal rainforest, and includes some steep uphill and downhill sections.

Skeleton & Bobsled

Your 3.5 hour Skeleton or Bobsled Sport Experience will begin with a sport orientation & safety guidelines. Then it is time for action as you head out to the track and up to the Maple Leaf start position, 1/3 of the way up the track. Minimum age of 14 years old to participate (14 yrs old to 16 yrs old must have 1 parent joining). Bobleigh: weight between 90 lbs (41 kg) and 270 lbs (122 kg) Skeleton: weight between 90 lbs (41 kg) and 220 lbs (100 kg) Starting from \$199 per person. December 17th to April.

Dog Sledding

Venture into the backcountry with a professional musher and a team of Alaskan Racing huskies. A icon Canadian adventure not to be missed! Tours run from 2.5 – 3 hours. Starting from \$519 per sled (based on two people sharing)

Snowshoeing Tours

Join in a guided snowshoe tour on Whistler Mountain or explore the old growth forests and glacier lakes around the Whistler area. Tours range from 1.5 to 4 hours. Tours are available for all fitness and ability levels. Starting from \$120 per person

Cross Country Skiing

Cross Country Skiers in Whistler have many options. There are over 28 kilometres of track-set cross-country trails that wind throughout scenic areas around The Lost Lake Park. There is also 90 kilometres of track-set cross-country trails available at The Whistler Olympic Park located in the Callaghan Valley 20 minutes south of Whistler Village. The Whistler Olympic Park also offers a change to experience the sport of Biathlon. Starting from \$119 per person

Heli-Skiing

Experience the trip of a lifetime in Whistler's alpine backcountry. Catch a birds-eye view of the Coast Mountain Range by helicopter then embark on a heart-pounding descent on one of Whistler famed peaks. This activity is for intermediate and advanced skiers only.
