How-to Guide

How do I instruct my patients to scan the QR codes?

Simply have your patient use the camera on their smartphone to scan the QR code.

(Note: A QR reader is usually built into the Camera app on iPhones and most Android phones. Some Android users may have to download a separate QR code reader. Open it, point at the QR code, and then select the link that pops up at the top of the screen.)

How do I make my own QR codes?

You can do one of the following:

1. Install this plugin for Google Chrome: <u>https://chrome.google.com/webstore/detail/</u> <u>quick-qr-code-generator/afpbjjgbdimpioenaedcjgkaigggcdpp</u>

To use the plugin, navigate to the page you wish to generate a QR code for, and click the little **D** button that has been added to your toolbar. Download the image of the QR code and insert it into your document.

2. Use a free QR code generator available online: <u>https://www.qr-code-generator.com</u>

Copy and paste the URL link to the page you wish to generate a QR code for into the textbox provided. You can even upload your own files, but be sure to remove all sensitive information before submitting the documents.
