MOC Section 3: Feedback (SAP)

Provide data with feedback to individual physicians regarding their current knowledge base, enabling the identification of needs and development of future learning opportunities relevant to their practice.

MOC Section 3: Feedback (SIM)

Provide data with feedback to individual physicians, groups or interprofessional health teams related to their personal or collective performance across a broad range of domains. Performance assessment activities can occur in a simulated or actual practice environment.

Improvement

(prev. Section 2: Systems Learning) Individual, group or systems improvement, QI activities to improve patient care, physician well-being, professional practice; health systems, EDI, planetary health, etc.

Self-assessment programs (SAP)

Cycle Requirements

- Five-year reporting cycle
- · Mainpro+ participants must earn and report a minimum of 250 credits in a five-year cycle. At least 125 must be certified credits, at least 10 of which must be Certified Assessment credits.
- Minimum of 25 credits from any category must be earned and reported each cycle year
- · Mandatory online credit reporting

Activity Categories



Certified Activities

Activities that have been formally reviewed and approved as per the standards for certified CPD as set by the CFPC.



Certified Assessment Activities

Certified activities in which data analysis, including providing or receiving feedback, stimulates self-reflection and leads to practice/ performance improvement. These may be self-directed or conducted with others.



Non-certified Activities

Activities that have not been formally reviewed by the College but comply with the College's definition of CPD, are non-promotional in nature, and provide valuable professional learning opportunities.

Carry-over Credits

In Mainpro+, up to 40 certified credits can be carried over to the next cycle. Carry-over credits are only applicable to a 5-year cycle, and if extra credits are reported beyond the overall cycle requirements from the last completed cycle.

Linking Learning Exercises

With our Linking Learning program, Mainpro+ participants can earn Certified Assessment credits by completing reflection on a variety of practice activities including teaching, research, assessment and administration.
