

## HIV Exposure?

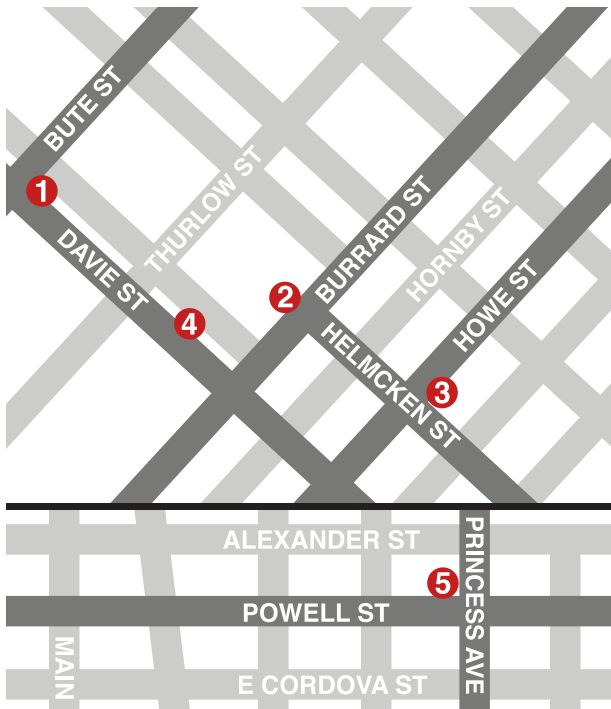
Have you engaged in activities that may have exposed you to HIV? A new pilot project provides drug therapy that can help reduce the risk of becoming HIV-positive.

Visit one of the clinics listed on the back within 72 hours of potential exposure resulting from unprotected sex or needle sharing. You may qualify for non-occupational post-exposure prophylaxis (NPEP).

Medication may be able to reduce the risk of infection.
